

Louth Drug Treatment Court?

The Louth Drug Treatment Court commenced in 2018 with over 100 clients so far referred from District Courts in Louth. The catchment area is for people appearing in District Court area No 6, residing in Co. Louth and areas of east Co. Meath and willing to engage with the programme and community based support services in Co. Louth.

The Drugs Court is a judicial initiative and is underpinned by the support and co-operation of a number of statutory and non-statutory agencies.

The Drugs Court is a judicial initiative and is underpinned by the support and co-operation of a number of statutory and nostatutory agencies. The main participating agencies are the Court Service, the Probation Service, An Garda Siochana, Turas and the Red Door Project.

A designated Drug Court Liaison Worker, funded by the Department of Justice in 2021 on a pilot basis, supports each participant in addressing their drug use and recovery.

Participation will be of most benefit to those who have no prior criminal convictions. The District Court Judge identifies potential participants. The Probation Service & An Garda Siochana complete an assessment of suitability. The Probation Service, An Garda Siochana and Court Practitioners can also suggest possible referrals to the Court for consideration.
